Sanitization Required.



- We will clean and sanitize our coaches, before every trip and at the end of the day.
- We will use products that meet CDC requirements for disinfection.
- Special focus on sanitizing high touch points.
- Entrance area handrails, parcel rack handrails, door latches.
- Headrests, armrests, seat belts and seat accessories.
- All surfaces in the restroom, including door handles.
- All surfaces within the driver's area.

Fresh Air Required.



- All cabin air completely exchanged with fresh air on highest setting.
- HVAC system anti-bacterial air filters will be replaced with greater frequency.
- HVAC system upgraded with **UV Light Disinfection** of air as it circulates the coach.

Wear a Mask Required.



- Passengers are required to wear a face covering while onboard the motor coach.
- BC Public School Students – K to G3 – Mask wear is not mandatory, but recommended.
- Maintain physical distancing as best you can, as you enter and exit the coach
- Group Leader / Tour Director to Screen Passengers to ensure are healthy.
- PLEASE do not have anyone in your group travel if sick.

Physical Distancing Required.



- Please stand apart by 6ft, when loading passengers.
- Board passengers to rear first.
- Disembark, passengers in front first.
- Hand Sanitizer located at front of bus for passenger use.
